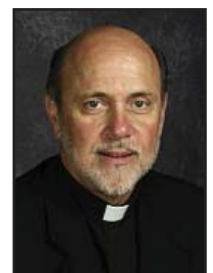

God is continually developing leaders to accomplish His purposes. God has blessed our community with the leadership and dedication of our teachers (seen at left & right) who help guide and direct the spiritual life of our students and school.

BRHS is a Catholic school offering a faith based education in the tradition of Blessed Edmund Rice and the Congregation of Christian Brothers. We believe that God is important and relevant in today's world. Brother Rice students come from over 175 different church backgrounds and over 60 cities of Metro Detroit. This diversity allows us to foster and invigorate a community of faith, share ideas, and evangelize within the mission of the church.



Since we believe that biblical truth is culturally relevant today, students engage in a 4 year Theology curriculum which offers the following course work: Catholic Christianity, New Testament, Old Testament, Church History/ World Religions, Christian Morality, Social Justice, Marriage and Family Living.

Brother Rice celebrates the value and dignity of each person and nurtures the development of the whole person. Therefore Brother Rice offers a variety of retreat programs, spiritually based after school activities, daily prayer, as well as leadership skills and instruction. Students participate in a variety of food, clothing, toy, blood, and charity drives to serve others in the community.

Every Brother Rice student serves the Lord and their neighbor by performing 15 hours of service to the community each year. Students work in their churches, health care facilities, or charitable organizations. Fulfilling an Essential Element of a Christian Brother education, 'Standing in solidarity with those marginalized by poverty and injustice' many of our students complete their service as part of a group in the following ways:



Winter Break Mission Trip

Students and faculty will journey to Glenmary Farm to work with the poor in Appalachia.



Spring Break Pilgrimage

Students, faculty, alumni, and friends take a pilgrimage to the birthplace of Edmund Rice, the founder of the Congregation of Christian Brothers, in Callan, Ireland.



International Mission Trip

During the summer, students, faculty, alumni and friends will participate in an International Mission Trip to Peru to work with our schools and with the poor.



Community Outreach

Lighthouse Thanksgiving Project: Each year 100 students assist in the packing of food baskets for Thanksgiving for the needy of Oakland County.

Lighthouse Christmas Project: Each year 50 students help with the distribution of Christmas gifts from Lighthouse to their clients prior to Christmas.

Jamieson Elementary School in Detroit: Working with the "Beyond Basics" writing program bi-weekly.

Stewart Elementary School in Detroit: Collecting books for all their students through our Gift of Reading Partnership and reading the books to the students.
